



Future prospects for “Medical Technology”

Brazil's market for medical technology grew in 2019 for the third year in a row. The private sector is benefiting from the recovery of the labour market and the resurgence in the number of privately insured people, while in the public sector digitisation is driving demand for medical technology. Roughly one-third of the demand for medical technology is produced locally, while the majority is imported from abroad. The pandemic, however, is driving the country back into recession and exacerbating the medical and economic crisis. The Brazilian government wants to take out a loan US\$ 36 million to strengthen the health sector project for the state of Serpipe.
